MICHAEL FORMICA AND BOB HIEMSTRA PAINT IT BLACK—AND WHITE—IN SUNNY PALM BEACH TEXT BY MARK WELSH - PHOTOGRAPHY BY BOB HIEMSTRA

















The contrast is most keenly felt in the living room, where Formica established two seating areas—each with an all-white sofa and slipper chairs of his own design and vintage side tables. Black Mongolian-lamb and zebra-print pillows are arranged on the sofas, geometric black-and-white Ettore Sottsass vases sit atop a milk-glass cocktail table, and silver makes an appearance in the vintage Pierre Cardin cocktail table across the way. Even the artwork is black and white. Hiemstra photographed the pair's New York collection of Alexandre

Noll sculptures before they headed South for the winter. "In the old days people traveling to Palm Beach would bring their entire art collection for the season," he says. "We decided that it would be a lot easier for me just to photograph our favorite pieces." Among the images on display are Noll #1 and Noll #2 above one of the sofas and Noll #3 in the adjacent dining area.

But just when every sign points to black and white's winning out over Technicolor, traces of the rainbow creep in. The dining table is
